## EPISTLE – Hebrews 13:7 - 16

Brethren, remember your leaders, those who spoke to you the word of God; consider the outcome of their lives, and imitate their faith. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever. Do not be led away by diverse and strange teachings; for it is well that the heart be strengthened by grace, not by foods, which have not benefited their adherents. We have an altar from which those who serve the tent have no right to eat. For the bodies of those animals whose blood is brought into the sanctuary by the high priest as a sacrifice for sin are burned outside the camp. So, Jesus also suffered outside the gate in order to sanctify the people through his own blood. Therefore, let us go forth to him outside the camp and bear the abuse he endured. For here we have no lasting city, but we seek the city which is to come. Through him then let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that acknowledge his name. Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God.

## GOSPEL – St. Matthew 4:12 - 17

At that time, Jesus when heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew into Galilee; and leaving Nazareth he went and dwelt in Capernaum by the sea, in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, that what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled: “The land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, toward the sea, across the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles — the people who sat in darkness have seen a great light, and for those who sat in the region and shadow of death light has dawned.” From that time Jesus began to preach, saying, “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.”

## Liturgical Notes For Today's Divine Liturgy

1. The Entrance with the Holy Gospel – “O Christ, the Angelic Powers appeared at Your tomb, the guards were as though dead and Mary stood by the grave seeking Your sacred Body. You destroyed Hades, yet remained untouched by it. You encountered the Virgin and through Her, bestowed life. Glory to You Who have risen from the dead.” / Ἅγγελικαὶ Δυνάμεις...
2. “As You were baptized in the Jordan, O Lord, the worship of the Trinity became manifest. For the voice of the Father gave added witness, naming You His beloved Son and the Spirit in the form of a dove confirmed the certainty of that word. O Christ, Who revealed Yourself as God and brought light to the world, glory to You.” /Ἐν Ἰορδάνῃ βαπτιζομένου σου Κύριε...
3. “With the rivers of your tears, you have made fertile the barren desert. From sighs of sorrow from deep within you your labors have borne fruit a hundred-fold. By your miracles, you have become a shining light upon the world. O Theodosius our venerable Father, intercede to Christ our God to save our souls.” /Ταῖς τῶν δακρύων σου ροαῖς... [Hymn for St. Theodosios the Cenobite]
4. “Since you are a deliverer of captives and a defender of the poor; a physician for the sick and a noble attendant to Kings, O great among the martyrs and glorious George, intercede to Christ that He may save our souls.” /Ως τῶν αἰχμαλώτων... [Hymn in honor of St. George]
5. Kontakion: “Today You appeared to the world, and Your light, O Lord, has left its mark upon us as in fully understanding we sing to You: ‘You came, You were made manifest, the unapproachable light.’” / Ἐπεφάνης σήμερον...

Other than an initial organizational meeting, most of the work will take place after the Festival, making this a manageable commitment for many.



## ***Did you Know?***

### **Question: What is Vasilopita?**

Vasilopita, meaning "Basil's pie," is a traditional cake or bread served on New Year's Day in Greece. It is typically baked with a hidden coin (which, in Greek is called "flourie" φλουρί) inside, which is believed to bring good luck to the person who finds it. The tradition is linked to the feast day of Saint Basil, celebrated on January 1st, and is a way to honor his legacy of generosity and kindness. The origins of vasilopita can be traced back to the story of St. Basil of Caesarea, since he would conceal coins in bread to return valuables to his followers during a time of crisis. This act of kindness evolved into the modern custom of baking vasilopita, where the hidden coin symbolizes fortune and blessings for the coming year.
