## GOSPEL – St. Mark 1:1 – 8

The beginning of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. As it is written in the prophets, 'Behold, I send my messenger before your face, who shall prepare your way; the voice of one crying in the wilderness: prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight —' John was baptizing in the wilderness and preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And there went out to him all the country of Judea, and all the people of Jerusalem; and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's hair, and had a leather girdle around his waist, and ate locusts and wild honey. And he preached, saying, "After me comes he who is mightier than I, the thong of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

2. “Make ready, O Zebulum; prepare yourself, O Nephthali; cease to flow, O River Jordan. Receive the Master Who comes to be baptized in joy. Adam rejoice with the first mother. Do not hide in Paradise as before, for He came to see us even naked that He may clothe us as we were before. Christ has appeared to renew all creation.””/Ετοιμάζου Ζαβουλών...
3. “Since you are a deliverer of captives and a defender of the poor; a physician for the sick and a noble attendant to kings, O Great among the Martyrs and Glorious George, intercede to Christ our God that He may save our souls.” [Hymn of St. George]/ Ως των αιχμαλώτων ελευθερωτής...
